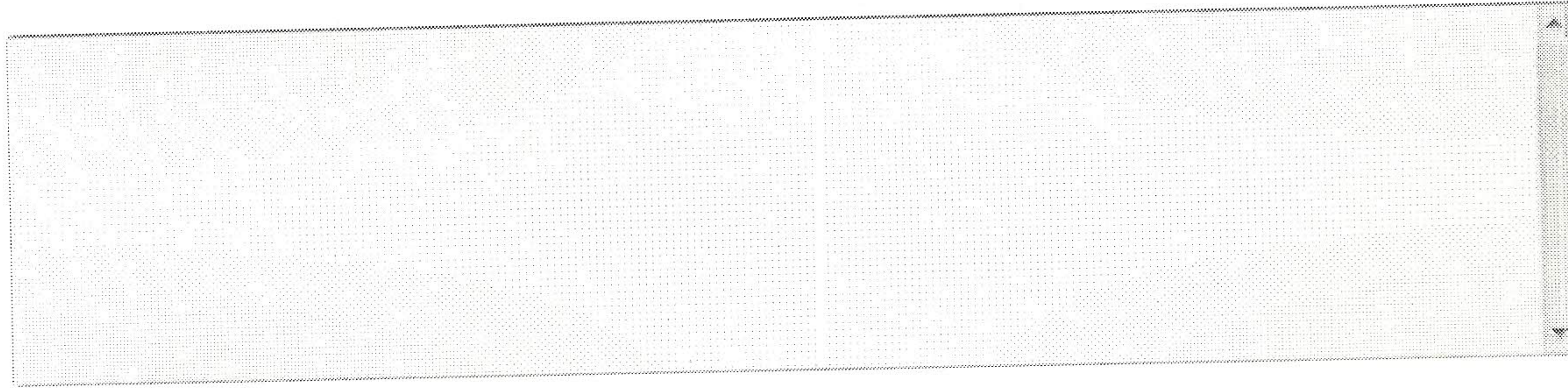

Furthermore, she returned student work in a timely fashion, and provided students with comments and helpful hints to aid student learning and understanding.

When appropriate, she would alter an assignment for another class, or, if reviewing student work made it clear to her that student understanding was low, she provided more time and opportunity for the class to learn the concept until she was satisfied they got it, before she moved on.
